Reminders

- Medical Forms -- for students planning to participate in spring sports are due before students can participate in practices.
- Planning an Absence? -- If you know in advance that your child will miss a day of school, please email your dean A WEEK IN ADVANCE. This will allow us to help your child plan ahead, get extra help, and often lessen the burden of catching up by completing some work before they go. (Starting in middle school, students are responsible for catching up both missed classwork and homework on time for planned absences, and extensions are not generally granted for absences that extend a school holiday.
